Government archives also disclosed that in the 1970's when Walt was stationed in Germany, Russia had a \$21 million-dollar annual budget for its remote viewing programs. Moreover, Walt's research of historical archives found that the Russian remote viewer team was in Berlin same time he was stationed there.

Walt has retained his fascination with RV phenomenon and plans to present a webinar program on RV along with Altea DeBee in January 2021.

In addition to volunteering for Habitat for Humanity overseas, Walt is also a world traveler. When he was stationed in Berlin in the late sixties, he traveled all of Western Europe. Every year, Walt continues to travel to a hardship destination on his own to sightsee and do volunteer work.

UFO Current State of Affairs: It's all about Who Defines Reality - Why U.S. Navy Guidelines for Pilots 'Rewrite' History.

[This month's commentary continues to explore notable changes regarding what appears to be a trend towards UFO transparency—a perceived step forward which may be, on closer analysis a step backwards. Are the U.S. Navy's new guidelines for reporting unidentified aerial phenomena (UAP) an official government acknowledgement that UFOs exist? Or is this so-called disclosure we've all been waiting for really a stealthy strategy. Is the government framing pilot encounters as threatening to get public support for further weaponizing space? -Maurene Morgan]

On April 23, 2019, the online journal *Politico* snagged the scoop of the year: an exclusive statement from the U.S. Navy announcing that it was drafting new guidelines for pilots and other personnel to report encounters with 'unidentified aerial phenomena' (UAPs). According to the Navy, "This would be a significant new step to formalize the process of reporting UAPs to authorities." The effort was said to be in response to increased sightings of unknown, advanced aircraft flying into or near Navy strike groups or other sensitive military facilities.

The *Politico* article implied that UFOs/UAPs are real and the U.S. government is now taking the phenomenon seriously. Mainstream media, Internet, and social media were abuzz with analyses and commentaries. Even newspapers with long histories of disparaging the topic, such as the *Washington Post*, responded with snappy articles like, "How Angry Pilots got the Navy to stop Dismissing UFO Sightings."

Like a well-oiled propaganda machine, three talking heads with curiously impressive resumes from the military, industrial and intelligence complex's highest rungs and darkest corners were virtually everywhere in print, TV and online news coverage.

Luis Elizondo, former head of the Pentagon's Advanced Aerospace Threat Identification Program (AATIP) and member of To the Stars Academy (TTSA), described the Navy's apparent new respect for UFO/UAP sighting reports as "the single greatest decision the Navy has made in decades." Chris Mellon, a former Pentagon intelligence official and ex-staffer on the Senate Intelligence Committee, and member of TTSA reiterated with,

“Right now, we have a situation in which UFO and UAPs are treated as anomalies to be ignored.... We have systems that exclude that information and dump it. They will dump the data because it is not a traditional aircraft or missile.” Former British Ministry of Defense UFO investigator, Nick Pope, called the Department of Defense’s statement a “bombshell revelation.”

Instead of probing the Navy about its new-found concern for UAPs, mainstream media pundits zeroed in on the infamous 2004 Tic Tac gun camera video. Many in the UFO community were also distracted by at what appeared to be a crack in the government’s decades-old UFO ‘Code of Silence’. Few pundits or ufologists were asking the difficult questions, such as, “Why now?” and “Is there an underlying agenda having little or nothing to do with ‘disclosure’?”

Alas, a closer look does suggest the guidelines are a ‘shell game’, a deceptive and evasive action intended to focus attention on the time of the 2004 Tic Tac incident to the present. The first ploy is to get rid of the troublesome term ‘UFO’ and replace it with a more modern term, ‘Unidentified Aerial Phenomenon’ (UAP). Change UFO to UAP and those pesky alleged 70 years of lies, misinformation, disinformation, and government coverups associated with ‘UFOs’ are gone. Gone, too, are the countless government claims it didn’t investigate UFOs because they represented no threat to national security.

That ‘shell game’ began nearly 70 years ago. In 1953, a scientific panel known as the Robertson Panel concluded UFOs were not a direct threat to national security, but could pose an indirect threat by overwhelming standard military communications due to public interest in the subject. Since the *real enemy is hysteria*, the Panel recommended a public education campaign should be undertaken in order to reduce public interest in the subject and civilian UFO groups should be monitored. With the Robertson Panel, the government policy of UFO denial became official.

Then, in 1969, the USAF-commissioned *Condon Report* [which grew out of *Project Blue Book*] concluded after two decades of research there was: 1) No UFO found to be a threat to our national security; 2) No evidence UFOs represented technological developments or principles beyond the range of modern science; and 3) No indication UFOs were extraterrestrial vehicles.

Written when the Cold War was in full swing, these reports were designed to debunk UFO sightings and discredit civilian UFO researchers in order to reassure, rather than inform, the public.



Stop the presses! Has the government just rewritten history? Now, virtually all mainstream media coverage since 2017 tells a very different story.

We are now being told: 1) The Pentagon’s Advanced Aerospace Threat Identification Program (AATIP) investigated UFOs for several years. Moreover, AATIP’s director asserted, “What was considered science fiction is now science fact,” and “the U.S. was incapable of defending itself against some of the technologies discovered.”

2) There are many accounts from the Navy and other services of unusual aerial activity interfering with military weapon platforms and displaying beyond-next-generation capabilities. 3) The phenomena do not seem to originate from any country. [Implying it’s ‘off-world’?]

Perhaps the Navy’s most egregious historical revision is their claim the guidelines are a response to the number of reports of unauthorized and/or unidentified aircraft entering various military-controlled ranges and designated air space in *recent years.*” To paraphrase the Navy’s statement in *Politico*, these incidents *now* need to be

recorded in the official record and studied—rather than dismissed as some kooky phenomena from the realm of science-fiction.

So, where's the evidence the US Navy guidelines are an "intentional forgetting of significant historical events?" Evidence abounds! Let's start with a collection of a few of the world's most famous quotes concerning military encounters with UFOs: There are many more!

- "The special committee on non-terrestrial science and technology [is] coming to grips with the reality that our planet is not the only one harboring intelligent life in the universe." - President Franklin D. Roosevelt, Top Secret Memo on White House stationery, Washington D.C., February 22, 1944.
- "Of course, the flying saucers are real and they are interplanetary." "More than 10,000 sightings [of Foo Fighters] have been reported [globally], the majority of which cannot be accounted for by any scientific explanation... I am convinced these objects do exist and they are not manufactured by any nation on Earth." - Air Chief Marshall Lord Dowding, Commander-in-Chief of the Royal Air Force Fighter Command during the Battle of Britain
- January 31, 1949 FBI document sent to J. Edgar Hoover [thanks to Barry Greenwood] reads, "At a recent weekly intelligence conference of G-2, ONI, OSI, and FBI in the Fourth Army area, officers of G-2 Fourth Army have discussed the matter of 'unidentified aircraft' or 'unidentified aerial phenomena', otherwise known as 'flying discs', 'flying saucers' and 'balls of fire'. This matter is considered top secret by intelligence officers of both the Army and Air Force." [The use of 'unidentified aerial phenomena' was used 70 years before Hilary Clinton and Nick Pope re-introduced it in 2016.]
- "Behind the scenes, high-ranking Air Force officers are soberly concerned about UFOs. But through official secrecy and ridicule, many citizens are led to believe unknown flying objects are nonsense." Former CIA Director, Roscoe Hillenkoetter, public statement, 1960.
- "We have, indeed, been contacted, perhaps even visited-by extraterrestrial beings, and the US government, in collusion with the other national powers of the Earth, is determined to keep this information from the general public." - Victor Marchetti - Former Special Assistant to the Executive Director of the CIA, "How the CIA Views the UFO Phenomenon." *Second Look* - Vol 1, No 7, May, 1979.
- "What I found [in doing research for the book Project Delta] was compelling evidence to claim that most of these aerial objects far exceeded the terrestrial technology of the era in which they were seen. I was forced to conclude there is a great likelihood that Earth is being visited by highly advanced aerospace vehicles under highly 'intelligent' control indeed." - Richard F. Haines, Retired NASA senior research scientist. Ames Research Center Research Institute for Advanced Computer Science, 1998.
- "There were actually two crashes at Roswell, which most people don't know." "It [the second crash] was within a few miles of where the original crash was. We think the reason they were in there at that time was to try and recover parts and any survivors of the first crash. I'm referring to the people from outer space—the guys whose UFO it was." – Col. Richard French, Air Force Intelligence, August, 2012"

While I don't want to address UFO incidents at military facilities because there are many superb books on the topic, we cannot leave out Hanford. Throughout the latter part of 1944 and early 1945, a series of "unknowns" were detected by radar flying over the Hanford Engineering Works Plant in Richland, WA.

On one occasion, six F6F Hellcats from Pasco Naval Airfield were dispatched to intercept one of them, but without success. One pilot described the object "as the size of three aircraft carriers' side by side, oval shaped, very streamlined, like a stretched-out egg, and pinkish in color."

After hovering in a fixed position above the Hanford Nuclear Reactor for an additional twenty minutes, the object disappeared going straight-up as the six Hellcats limped back to the Pasco Naval Air Station. On another



occasion, an object picked up by radar over Hanford was described as a huge, glowing red ball. [Artist depiction of fighter jet in pursuit of a red glowing ball over Hanford]

The first two excerpted declassified memos below were sent from HQ Fourth Air Force, Office of the Commanding General, California to Commanding General Armed Forces, Washington, DC.:

January 23, 1945: Air Defense Measures at Hanford Engineering Company Secret: Resulting from an unidentified aircraft flying over Hanford, WA on at least three nights during the past month. this HQ has requested from WDC to move a battery of search lights from Seattle to the Pasco plant... The Thirteenth Naval District has made arrangements for Naval Station, Pasco, to employ both radar and fighter aircraft in attempting interception of these unidentified aircraft. ...One incident has occurred.. in which a brief radar contact was made—attempted night interception again failed.

January 25, 1945: Request for Night Fighters at Pasco, WA. Western Defense Command and Army Commands... at the Hanford Eng Co, Pasco, have informally asked HQ ... for one or more-night fighter aircraft to be based, temporarily, at Naval Air Station, Pasco, for employment against the alleged "boogie" which has been detected by radar on several nights in the past three weeks.

This is an excerpt from a declassified memo from Headquarters, 637th Aircraft Control and Warning Squadron, Moses Lake, WA, Air Force Base.

May 23, 1949. Subject: Project "Signs"

To: Chief of Staff, USAF, Washington DC, Attention: Director of intelligence, Requirement Division

At 1330 a call was received from the Hanford Area that a *Flying Saucer* [their italics] was over the East 200 area approximately four miles east of the Hanford Atomic Plant, Washington. The operator at Hanford stated that the Disk was standing still and then tool off in a south-easterly direction at a speed greater than that of a jet fighter. The available aircraft was called for by the Hanford operator and scrambled. ...The scopes were instructed to search the southern sector with no results. Crew personnel and the controlled searched the sky, visually, and noted a round, white or silver object traveling in a northeasterly direction at a speed greater than that of jet fighters.

The evidence UFOs/UAPs has been taken seriously at the highest circles ever since the early 1940's should be apparent even with the handful of quotes presented above, let alone scores of declassified documents. Perhaps the following quote brings the subject down to earth in plain language.

In September 1947, General Nathan Twining, commander of the Air Material Command at Wright Field, wrote on the subject of "flying discs" in a letter to the Commander of the Army Air Forces that largely sums up the official stance on UFOs:

"The phenomenon is real and not visionary or fictitious. ...something extraordinary was being seen." Twining adds, "The public stance of the Army Air Force was the objects [were] most likely mistaken

observations of mundane phenomena. *In this respect the military could continue to monitor the phenomenon without arousing public suspicions.*”

Regardless of the initial integrity of their motives during the Cold War, the masters of deception created a seamless weave of images, pseudo facts, and explanatory narratives that knit together into a pseudo-environment—an official reality manufactured by the engineers of social control.

We should not be surprised the ‘powers-that-be’ are now disclosing the existence of secret Pentagon programs to study UFOs and validate pilot encounters with them to a largely passive and credulous press happy to generate sensational UFO headlines. Nor should we be surprised when virtually all media reports are filtered through the ‘threat’ lens.

Which is the lie? UFO were not a threat in the past when they were, or they’re a threat now when they aren’t? One must ask why the story changed now?

Could the UFO/UAP revelations since 2017 be tied to President Trump’s declaring space to be a “warfighting domain,” and by establishing a Space Force, the newest branch of the armed services? You can be sure the Space Force isn’t about Chinese ‘killer satellites’ because the US already spends *more on the military than the next 10 countries combined*. The Chinese don’t need to spend trillions on weapons. Instead, they’re spending their trillions on infrastructure and manufacturing products—killing us ‘softly’ one pair of socks at a time.

Are the US Navy guidelines a sneaky backdoor entrance to further weaponizing space, increase military spending, and an opportunity to disclose all of the advanced technology developed with a limitless black budget? One must also ask if the government’s focus on UFO ‘threat technologies’ is linked to the **\$22 trillion dollars** in unaccounted government transactions, primarily for defense. [Mark Skidmore, an economist at Michigan State, and Catherine Austen Fitts, publisher of the *Solari Report* and assistant Secretary of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) under George H. Bush, have been alerting the public about missing DOD and HUD money since 2000].

You’re right if you detect an undercurrent of anger in this commentary—and I hope you are angry as well—because our history has been taken from us by unelected officials who replaced it with a false history. If you take the quotes sited above as evidence, UFOs from other worlds are entering our air space all the time and have been for decades—if not for millennia.



Moreover, no one should be more enraged than pilots, whether military, commercial, or private because UFOs do present a serious risk to aviation. That it took Navy pilots sounding the alarm to finally get the DOD to take the phenomenon seriously is ludicrous! If the DOD is dissing military pilots it has to because they don’t need their reports. Every sensor system they have is must be recording events that cannot be explained—and have been for decades. Regarding the 2004 Nimitz incident, multiple radar system, followed by visual sightings by pilots confirmed the existence of multiple craft conducting maneuvers survivable by humans due to excessive G-forces. Further, it was not a singular event, but continued for a couple of weeks. And yet, fifteen years passed before the new guidelines were formalized.

Perversely, a US Air Force Academy physics textbook published in 1968, *Introductory Space Science-Vol. II*, included a chapter (33) titled, “Unidentified Flying Objects.” A sub-chapter titled Operational Domains—Temporal and Spatial, begins with this statement: “What we will do here is to present evidence that UFO’s are a global phenomenon which may have persisted for many thousands of years.” It talks about ancient mythologies, including Indian stories of a possible nuclear exchanges between beings who came to earth thousands of years ago. Reading this textbook is like reading a script for *Ancient Aliens*. Chapter 33 was yanked in 1970 after the Condon Committee released its report. I learned about the textbook from a MUFON witness

who reported that he had been a trained UFO spotter on a ship in the Mediterranean during the Viet Nam War. If only military personnel today were as well informed as their fathers. It is essential the military, FAA (Federal Aviation Administration) and the ICAO (International Civil Aviation Organization) come clean to pilots about UFOs and the dangers they present. Background in procedures in the event of a UFO encounter must be a non-negotiable part of training to earn a Pilot's License.

The FAA should also train tower personnel on UFOs and admit that odd things that may be alien craft are observed from time to time, both on radar and visually. All pilots should be informed of any nearby UFOs. Some military and civil air controllers have disclosed that they are instructed to deny a UFO is on radar and to turn aircraft away from any unidentified object.

And yet, both the FAA and *Aeronautical Information Manuals* provide the instructions given below for reporting UFO. Even weirder, Chapter 13 of the 1994 *Fire Officer's Guide to Disaster Control* is entitled, "Enemy Attack and UFO Potential." Chapter subtitles include: 1) The UFO Threat – A Fact, 2) Adverse Potential of UFOs, and 3) UFOs – Emergency Actions. The manual doesn't come out and say UFOs are real, but it's written as if it is known that they are. All documents referenced are available online.



What lesson can we take from this? Ufology has been led down the garden path before and we must never follow blindly. We need to be suspicious and to never simply believe that which we've been told. We need to ask questions until we get answers and then challenge the answers. We can start by taking a vow to never suspend critical reasoning and always question whether government intelligence has had a hand in manipulating our beliefs about ufology.

Let's end this commentary with quotes from a top-secret letter written in June 1947 to President Truman by Albert Einstein and J. Robert Oppenheimer, Director of Advanced Studies, Princeton. It was titled, "Relationships with Inhabitants of Celestial Bodies."

"Relationships with extraterrestrial men presents no basically new problem from the standpoint of international law; but the possibility of confronting intelligent beings that do not belong to the human race would bring up problems whose solutions it is difficult to conceive." "Lastly, we should consider the possibility that our atmospheric tests of late could have influenced the arrival of celestial scrutiny. They could have been curious or alarmed by such activity...." Concerned about a possible catastrophic mis-


identification of UFOs for ICBMs, they conclude: “It is our professional opinion based on submitted data that this situation is extremely perilous, and measures must be taken to rectify a very serious problem are apparent.”

Perhaps the real reason the intelligence/military complex’s adherence to an official policy discouraging pilot reports of UFOs is because they cannot acknowledge an inability to respond to an omnipotent threat, or even to a non-human presence. Food for thought. – Maurene Morgan

A Blast from the Past: “It’s a Damned Lie!”

Review: *Tell My Story - June Crain, the Air Force, and UFOs* by James Clarkson. Olympia, WA: Black Triangle Press, 2010 (Third Printing - Revised with additional material included, 2017. Softcover).

In 1993 while giving a presentation at the Ocean Shores, WA library, UFO investigator, James Clarkson, met a woman who claimed to know what he said was true—that UFO’s are real and the Government knows all about it. When asked how she knew, she replied, “Because I worked there.” When he asked for details, the woman said, I can’t tell you—they’ll come and arrest me.”



Four years later, in 1997, the woman called him back. *CNN* had just covered the Air Force’s Press Release, “Roswell – Case Closed,” in which it denied a crashed alien craft and non-human bodies had been recovered near Roswell, NM in 1947.

Clarkson had barely said “Hello,” when he heard irate June’s voice. “It’s a damned lie!” Have you been watching *CNN*? It’s the damned weather balloon lie. They used it before.”

June Crain, a pillar of her community, announced that she had decided to break her national security oath. At 72 years of age, she had been diagnosed with terminal cancer and was now ready to talk about her work at the Wright Air Development Center between 1942 and 1952—a pivotal period in

the formulation of the official policy of UFO Denial and Cover Up. Intensely proud of her work for the government, June provided extensive and verifiable documentation.

At Wright Field, June held a Q-level clearance, one of the highest civilian security clearances in a top-secret government laboratory. A highly-skilled typist (the highest position a woman could hold at that time), she was in the center of it all—from Project Paperclip (bringing German scientists to Wright Field after the war, including Verner Van Braun) to parachute development and testing in the Aerobee rocket program (precursor to NASA), crash retrievals, and Project Bluebook (the Air Force’s spurious study of UFO sightings). She worked every day with the scientists studying the flying saucers and recovered bodies.

In her interview with Clarkson, June gave detailed testimony about frequent sightings of UFOs over the White Sands missile test range, and accounts of at least three UFO crash retrievals. She told about her discussion with an Air Force master sergeant who had arrived in a military transport from New Mexico delivering “two little men ... non-humans... described as greenish-blue. Later, an officer in her classified research unit let her handle a piece of metal that he told her was a ‘piece of a spaceship. “Her testimony included recollections of

discussions among engineers about the exceptional acceleration and G-Force demonstrated by UFOs, which were far beyond any human technology or human to withstand.

Tell My Story is a remarkable book told through verbatim interviews that make you feel as though you're in the room with June Crain and James Clarkson, and a fly on the wall at Wright Field. Accompanying commentaries place June's story into the context of the history of the UFO phenomena since World War II.

A chance encounter between a police detective/UFO researcher and a former government worker at a small-town library saved June Crain's story from being lost forever. Just a year later after the interviews, she was gone. Thanks to June Crain's determination to have her story told and Clarkson's interviewing skills, we can now better understand that Roswell is anything but "Case Closed."



James Clarkson, who is now retired from a 40-year career in military and public law enforcement, has been investigating the UFO mystery for the past 30 years with the same attention to detail that he applied to criminal investigations. In 1986 he joined MUFON and is a former Washington MUFON State Director. He has lectured at many UFO events across the country and in Paris, and appeared on radio and TV.


